Why Change?

"If something isn't broken don't fix it" we do not like change we want things to stay the same, or do we. When it comes to the house we all like a vacuum cleaner instead of a broom well before 1908 we couldn't since James Spangler only just invented it. Had it not been for the sales promotion of Mr Hoover it might never had made it to the commercial market place. Before 1880 we would not have got stuck behind a caravan and imagine before 1892 there was no such thing as a tractor, imagine how fast we could travel then, except most of us were only able to walk as cars were a rarity the first mass produced car the Model T Ford not being produced until 1908.

When it comes to church most of us are even more certain that we do not want change, things are all right as they are. Well if we do not want change, the average preach in the seventeenth century was at least an hour and the congregations usually stood or if we go back even further services were in Latin or further still the early church services were in homes and hired rooms no sense of a Church building then.

What we really mean is we like what we like and do not like anything else but think back to the Golden Age when Sunday school was a must, two services a day were the norm and nothing else happened on a Sunday ever. As a youth I recall serving at a minimum of three services a morning every Sunday and then once on a Wednesday before School. So really we do not usually mean "we do not like change that has taken place", we are concerned about where change might lead us to or what might happen to the bits we like now?

First I have to ask a question for whom does Church exist?. Certainly not for those of us who are members!! The church is the body of Christ on earth hear to do the work of Jesus which as he said Himself " is to preach good news.... and recovery of sight to the blind" We exist for those who are not yet members therefore our question should be what must we do to reach the others who do not come? Once we have the answer to that question the next stage is simple, do it!!

So before we next complain about change ask this question is it having an effect ? Are new folk coming in? If not perhaps we try something else or would you prefer the hour glass back in the pulpit K V Beaumont FCMI

HAPPY BIRTHDAY, MOBILE PHONES

Forty years ago this year, an American inventor, Martin Cooper, made the world's first call on a mobile phone. They took a little while to catch on in the UK, but when they did it was like a pandemic. Nowadays you can't get on a train or a bus or walk down the street without seeing



them in use - people apparently talking to themselves, but actually conversing with an invisible friend or colleague.

The secret of their success is that they tap into an absolutely fundamental human need: to talk. The toddler can't wait to talk, and parents can't wait for those amazing first words. Trying to stop people talking is like trying to dam a mountain stream.

Texting, networking, keeping up with friends or just totally meaningless chatter ("Hello, I'm on the train"), we just can't stop talking.

Far from being an odd thing, this is actually entirely natural. Like the Creator in whose image we are made, we are communicating beings. The first specific activity of God in the Bible was to speak: 'God said, "Let there be light".' Jesus is called 'the Word'. Every moment of the human story is illuminated by speech.

When we ask 'What's in a word?', the answer is, everything. We remember words long after they were spoken, for good or ill. Physical wounds heal, but the memory of an unkind or bitter word lingers for a life-time.

It can even be a single word, which simply changes everything 'Sorry'.

If that's what one word can do, then in the midst of all our chattering on Mr Cooper's invention perhaps we need to remember that words are precious jewels, to be enjoyed, but never to be carelessly or irresponsibly spoken.

Cyprus Musical Mission 2013 Update by Area - June 2013

PAPHOS. The Anglican Church of St. Stephen's Tala will be hosting the Choir Rehearsals, starting in September and led by Sara Jones, with the Orpheus Choir as the backbone of the Paphos Choir. After the return of Terry Jones to UK a new \gg Co-ordinator is now being sought to bring together other singers for the Paphos Choir. Several Churches are involved and a venue has yet to be chosen.

LIMASSOL. The Premier Choir is the backbone of the Limassol Choir for the musical with Margaret Yates and Christine Goldsmith as the co-ordinators for the singer in this area, members of St. Barnabas Anglican Church. Several of the many English-speaking churches are involved and in particular the choir from Episkopi led by Jane Roberts, who have decided to join the Limassol production. The Venue has still to be decided.

LARNACA. Over 40 people came together for a run through of the whole musical at Larnaca Community Church in early June and rehearsals are now set to begin on Wednesday 11th September, led by Graham & Beth Oldfield. LCC will host the Larnaca performance and also host a Worship Seminar both on Saturday 16 November, the first events in Cyprus.

AYIA NAPA. The Mayor of Ayia Napa has generously offered the Town Hall free of charge for an Ayia Napa production on Sunday 17 Nov. There is a possibility that a performance could be staged in SE Cyprus. Discussions are ongoing with various parties and the decision will be included in future updates.

FAMAGUSTA. The Classic Choir at the Eastern Mediterranean University has decided to take part in this Musical Mission tour. Students mainly from Nigeria and Iran make up the Choir, led currently by Chide, who is also choir director for St.Mark's Anglican Church in Famagusta. The performance will take place at the University on Monday 18th November, probably at 6.30pm.

KYRENIA. George Ward, music director of St Andrew's Church Choir is leading the musical preparation and has invited anyone who enjoys a sing to join the chorus. The practices have begun in preparation for the production on Tuesday 19th November as part of the Centenary Celebrations for St Andrew's. Venue has yet to be confirmed.

UPDATE on Funding. So far, donations have been received or promised from 3 of the Areas and approx €900 has been given, towards the estimated €4,000 budget. Now we are continuing to seek Sponsors from a variety of sources - holiday companies, charitable foundations, prayer partners, link dioceses and churches... Pray with us that the funds needed will be with us by early September. The tickets for the Team from UK have already been purchased at approx £200 each (for 5 team members), now arriving on Thursday 14 November in PAPHOS from Manchester. Funds are needed for the central costs flights, local transport, some PA hire, towards central publicity etc
