We will also run a bar.

Shortly after Miko's event, we will welcome Portsmouth Cathedral choir on the 24th October. St Andrew's will host the "grand finale" of their tour in Cyprus, and are very much looking forward to Evensong also on the 24th at 4.30 pm followed by a concert at 7 pm, both in church. Another "not to be missed" event, the information is also here in the magazine and on the website. As I write this, we were delighted with a church full to overflowing on October 1st, almost 150 people came for a celebration of God's love and grace in baptism and many visitors, including a group on Pilgrimage. It is heart-warming and

uplifting to sense the joy in worship and fellowship that we are sharing and celebrating. Once again we are delighted that we have to use the "overflow" facilities downstairs, as the screen and projector come into their own.

As the seasons slip quietly from one to the other, we look forward to all that God has prepared for us, a rich variety of worship, of serving our local community and of engaging with God's bigger world. # An Evening With Miko Peled

It is a huge honour for St Andrew's to be able to welcome Miko Peled to Cyprus and to host this event. He will be speaking at **The Hermitage**, **Kyrenia** on **Saturday 21st October 2017** at **7pm**.

We will be running a bar and serving refreshments. The evening may be cool, so do bring a shawl or fleece should shoulders get chilly as we sit under the trees and listen to his talk, which we are sure will be thought provoking. Miko will invite questions and there will be an opportunity to buy a signed copy of his book *The General's Son: Journey of an Israeli in Palestine*.

Miko was born in Jerusalem in 1961 and grew up in Motza Illit to a prominent Zionist family: his grandfather, Avraham Katsnelson, signed Israel's Declaration of Independence. His father, Mattityahu (Matti) Peled, fought in the 1948 war and served as a general in the war of 1967. Later, after the Israeli cabinet ignored Matti's investigation of a 1967 alleged Israeli war crime, he became a peace activist and leading proponent of an Israeli dialogue with the Palestine Liberation Organization (PLO). He condemned the Israeli military for seizing the West Bank, Gaza, Sinai and the Golan Heights, calling the war a "cynical campaign of territorial expansion". He was marginalized and shunned for his activism, and call for a two-state solution.

Miko Peled followed his father's footsteps at first, joining Israel's Special Forces after high school and earning the red beret. However he soon grew to regret his decision. He surrendered his status as soon as he earned it, becoming a medic, and finally,

disgusted by the 1982 Lebanon invasion, he buried his service pin in the dirt.



In 1997, Peled's 13-year-old niece Smadar was killed in a suicide attack in Jerusalem. This became the starting point for the remarkable personal story of a man who sought justice not through revenge but through understanding.

Peled is the author of a blog (https://mikopeled.com) which is dedicated to creating peace between Israelis and Palestinians, to tearing down Israel's separation wall and advocating equal rights for Israelis and Palestinians. He is an accomplished public speaker who has lectured throughout the world.

This evening is an event not to be missed. Tickets cost £10 (or equivalent in other currencies). The entry price includes refreshments.

## SPECIAL DAYS THIS MONTH

Luke the Evangelist is one of the four Evangelists traditionally ascribed authors of the canonical Gospels. The early church fathers ascribed to him authorship of both the Gospel according to Luke and the book of Acts of the Apostles, which would mean Luke contributed over a quarter of the text of the New Testament, more than any other author.

The New Testament mentions Luke briefly a few times, and the Pauline epistle to the Colossians refers to him as a doctor (from Latin for *teacher*); thus he is thought to have been both a physician and a disciple of Paul. Christians since the faith's early years have regarded him as a saint. He is believed to have been a martyr, reportedly as having been

hanged from an olive tree, though some believe otherwise. Many scholars believe that Luke was a Greek physician who lived in the Greek city of Antioch in Ancient Syria, though some other scholars and theologians think Luke was a Hellenic Jew. He had become a disciple of the apostle Paul and later followed Paul until Paul's martyrdom. Having served the Lord continuously,

unmarried and without children, filled with the Holy Spirit he died at the age of 84 years.

The Roman Catholic Church and other major denominations venerate him as **Saint Luke the Evangelist** and as a patron saint of artists, physicians, bachelors, surgeons, students and butchers; **his feast day takes place on 18 October.** 

# Christian influence of Halloween

Today's Halloween customs are also thought to have been influenced by Christian dogma and practices derived from it. Halloween is the evening before the Christian holy days of All Saints' Day or Hallowmass on 1 November and All Souls' Day on 2 November, thus giving the holiday on 31 October the full name of All Hallows' Eve. Since the time of the early Church, major feasts in Christianity had vigils that began the night before, as did the feast of All Hallows'. These three days are collectively called Allhallowtide and are a time for honoring the saints and praying for the recently departed souls who have yet to reach Heaven. Commemorations of all saints and martyrs were held by several churches on various dates, mostly in springtime. The feast of All Hallows', on its current date in the Western Church, may be traced to Pope Gregory III's (731–741) founding of an oratory in St Peter's for the relics "of the holy apostles and of all saints, martyrs and confessors". In 835, All Hallows' Day was officially switched to 1 November, the same date as Samhain, at the behest of Pope Gregory IV. Some suggest this was due to Celtic influence, while others suggest it was a Germanic idea. They may have seen it as the most fitting time to do so, as it is a time of 'dving' in nature. It is also suggested that the change was made on the "practical grounds that Rome in summer could not accommodate the great number of pilgrims who flocked to it", and perhaps because of public health considerations regarding Roman Fever - a disease that claimed a number of lives during the sultry summers of the region.

By the end of the 12th century across Europe "it was customary for criers dressed in black to parade the streets, ringing a bell of mournful sound and calling on all good Christians to remember the poor souls. "Souling", the custom of baking and sharing soul cakes for all christened souls, has been suggested as the origin of trick-or-treating. The custom dates back at least as far as the 15th century. Groups of poor people, often children, would go door-to-door during Allhallowtide, collecting soul cakes, in exchange for praying for the dead, especially the souls of the givers' friends and relatives. As with the Lenten tradition of hot cross buns, Allhallowtide soul cakes were often marked with a cross, indicating that they were baked as alms. Shakespeare mentions souling in his

comedy *The Two Gentlemen of Verona*. On the custom of wearing costumes, Christian minister Prince Sorie Conteh wrote: "It was traditionally believed that the souls of the departed wandered the earth until All Saints' Day, and All Hallows' Eve provided one last chance for the dead to gain vengeance on their enemies before moving to the next world. In order to avoid being recognized by any soul that might be seeking such vengeance, people would don masks or costumes to disguise their identities".

With regard to the evil spirits, on Halloween, "barns and homes were blessed to protect people and livestock from the effect of witches, who were believed to accompany the malignant spirits as they travelled the earth. In the 19th century, in some rural parts of England, families gathered on hills on the night of All Hallows' Eve. One held a bunch of burning straw on a pitchfork while the rest knelt around him in a circle, praying for the souls of relatives and friends until the flames went out.

On All Hallows' Eve, Christians in some parts of the world visit cemeteries to pray and place flowers and candles on the graves of their loved ones.
