News from The Hermitage

Dear Friends

At this time of the year, leaves are falling everywhere, even in Cyprus, not as much as the UK, or Western countries but with the darker evenings and a winter chill setting in we are confronted yet again with the eternal change of seasons. As trees become bare and the leaves that fall become dry and die, we can be reminded of our own life span and mortality.

One of the most significant additions to our annual church services in the past few years has been the All Souls service which takes place on the 2nd November. We use the image of a leaf to write the name of departed loved ones, and they are attached to what we call a "Remembering Tree". During the service the leaves are gathered up and brought to the altar to place into God's eternal and everlasting care.

There is a profound message here for us as Christians. We see the physical trees all around us become bare and to all intents and purposes "dead" as the leaves fall. However, despite what we see with our eyes and experience, we know, although we cannot see it, that the trees will spring into life again and the leaves will return. This is a wonderful parallel for us as children of God when all around us, in our own mortal lives and in the world, we are given hope and the promise of everlasting life. We cannot see what shape that promise will take just as currently we cannot see fresh leaves budding but we know they will come and we can commend our loved ones to that love that has conquered death.

Despite the fact we do not see our loved ones and we grieve their loss, we can find comfort and reassurance that we are still together in God's love. May we all know that love that knows no boundaries in this life and the next.


On Thursday November 2nd we will be having our All Souls service at 2.pm.

### Feast of Christ the King - 20 November

It refers to the concept of the Kingdom of God where the Christ is imagined as seated at the Right Hand of God. The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, commonly referred to as the Feast of Christ the King, is a relatively recent addition to the Western liturgical calendar, having been instituted in 1925 by Pope Pius XI for the Roman Catholic Church in response to growing secularism. The Anglican, Lutheran, and many other Protestant churches adopted it

along with the Revised Common Lectionary, occasionally referring to it as Christ the King Sunday.

Many religious facilities are named in honor of Christ the King.

# The Foundation for Relief & Reconciliation in the Middle East (FRRME)

Today I met with Marlene, her husband Jinan, and their two children Mariam (9) and Miran (5). This family graciously shared their story with me and it is one that I will never forget. Marlene is from a small town near Mosul. She lived there with her immediate and extended family until her father was brutally killed by al-Qaeda in 2007.

Her father worked at the local church alongside the priest - her father and the priest were killed together (Marlene witnessed this). The man responsible threatened everyone and told them they were not allowed to bury her father, that he would personally kill anyone who tried. Thankfully, Marlene's brother was able to sneak into the church and recover the body and the family was able to give him a Christian burial. After the murder of their father, Marlene and her family received several death threats and so they fled to Qaraqosh, a Christian town near Mosul. Here, a few weeks later Marlene's mother passed away. Marlene is the eldest of 7 inherited the responsibility of caring for her young siblings. Money was extremely tight and the family were forced into putting two of the younger brothers into an orphanage as they could not support them.

In 2008, Marlene brought her family to Jambour where her husband's family is from. They lived there with her husband's 4 handicapped sisters. They struggled to support the increasing number of family members dependent on them. The local church provided them with a tiny windowless house that was not really habitable - they were told they could live there if they could repair it. As Christians, it was difficult to find work and they struggled constantly to make ends meet. When Daesh came things got worse. More young Sunni men in the town were recruited to join Daesh and the Christian families were increasingly threatened, scared and vulnerable. The family tried to flee to Erbil seven times, often sleeping rough, terrified of what was happening back in Jambour. Each time they were refused entry until finally in 2014 the Kurdish police allowed them and 50 other Christian families to go to the city of Dohuk.

In Dohuk living conditions were not much better. Marlene lived with her family in a tiny house with 23 other people and was helped once more by a local church. Eventually, they were kicked out of the house, so she set up a tent for her family outside. She struggled to find a way to send her children to school. During this time her uncle was kidnapped by Daesh and to this day they still do not know his fate.

Things changed for the better in 2015 when they came to Jordan. They moved to Madaba (a town to the south of Amman) where they found support and hope from the Christian community there. We supported by providing the family with money for rent. They live in a tiny flat but their faith is ever present. Posters of Jesus are taped to the wall and this time there is at least one window to let some light in.

### All Saints Day and All Souls Day

All Saints Day, All Hallow's Day or Hallowmas falls on November 1st each year. It's a day for remembering all the Christian saints and martyrs and paying tribute to them with festivals and religious services. All Saints Day is followed by All Souls Day on November 2nd. All Souls Day is all about remembering all those who have died.

Both Anglicans and Roman Catholics celebrate All Saints' Day by holding a festival to remember all holy saints. The tradition of celebrating the saints and martyrs has been marked by Christians ever since the 4th century but it was only formalised for the first time in 609AD when Pope Boniface IV decreed that all martyrs should also be celebrated on the 13th May during something he called the Feast of All Holy Martyrs. In 837AD Pope Gregory IV extended the festival to include saints, renaming the festival the Feast of All Saints and changing the date to November 1st and the festival has been marked on that date ever since. According to Mark Wood at Christian Today many evangelical protestants are uncomfortable with saints as it seems to rank some Christians more highly than others. Thus many Christians extend the celebration of All Saints Day to everyone who is a Christian. 'We are all saints, in a biblical sense,' he writes.

'So All Saints Day is a time to be thankful for all those Christians who have lived before us, whether they are officially saints or not. Some are the great teachers ad prophets from history. Some are those who've taught and inspired us personally. Some are our friends and family. We can thank God for their witness, and for the way they have transmitted the faith down the generations. We can learn from their lives. We can take time to be grateful for what we've received, and to recommit ourselves to follow in their footsteps.' Kenya Sinclair, a writer at Catholic Online, echoes this sentiment saying All Saints Day is a 'call to live as saints'.

All Souls' Day is usually the day after All Saints' Day and is all about praying for the souls of the dead so they can leave purgatory and go to heaven. During All Souls' prayers, Christians ask for God's mercy for them. This is also the day the Book of the Dead is opened near the altar of churches to allow people to write the names of their relatives that they want to be remembered.

Christians have been praying for their departed brothers and sisters since the earliest days of Christianity. Early liturgies and inscriptions on catacomb walls attest to the ancientness of prayers for the dead, even if the Church needed more time to develop a substantial theology behind the practice. Praying for the dead is actually borrowed from Judaism, as indicated in 2 Maccabees 12:41-42. In the New Testament, St Paul prays for mercy for his departed friend Onesiphorus (2 Timothy 1:18).

All Souls' Day tends to be more prevalent in European Catholic church but is related to similar events worldwide. In Mexico for example, there is the Day of the Dead (Dia de los Muertos) and in China there is the Chinese Ghost Festival.


