








February is one of those months which seems to be a betwixt and between time. Although in the northern hemisphere we might still be experiencing the occasional

cold blast of winter, even here in Mediterranean Cyprus, yet the promise of springtime isn't too far behind. Indeed, in Ireland our Celtic ancestors saw 1st February as the first day of spring and celebrated the Feast of Imbolc (pronounced *imolg*) on that day.

It appears as though Imbolc had been celebrated for generations, at least since Neolithic times. In their wisdom, rather than condemning such practices as being "pagan" and things which should be done away with, the first Christian missionaries to the Celtic lands, particularly Ireland, recognised the deep spiritual yearning that



humankind has for such important times and places. Imbolc was associated with the fertility goddess Brigid and so those first missionaries Christianised this to the festival of Saint Brigid on 1st February. And so it continues today, with the making of St Brigid's Crosses being one of the highlights of the school year for children in Ireland.



Because Imbolc celebrated the start of springtime, one of the traditions associated with it was the lighting of fires and candles to commemorate the strengthening power of the sun. This tradition may be the origin of the Christian Feast of **Candlemas** which is celebrated on 2nd February (or the Sunday closest to that date - this year we will celebrate the Feast on 3rd February). In some churches candles are lit and processed during the service, surely a distant folk memory of our ancestors' practice at this important "turning point" of the year.

At Candlemas we read of the revelation of Jesus in the Temple where he is joyfully greeted by Simeon and Anna. Simeon recites that beautiful hymn, one of the evening canticles from the Prayer Book, the Nunc Dimittis, often used at funeral services: Lord now lettest thou thy servant depart in peace: according to thy word.

For mine eyes have seen:

thy salvation;

which thou hast prepared:

before the face of all people;

To be a light to lighten the Gentiles: and to be the glory of thy people Israel.

But Simeon goes on to address Jesus' mother, Mary with these words:

'This child is destined for the falling and the rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be opposed so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed and a sword will pierce your own soul too.'

So, we too are reminded of what is to come - the Passion of Our Lord and Easter.

Thus, Candlemas is also a "turning point" in the Church's liturgical year. It marks the end of the Christmas/Epiphany season when we celebrated with joy the coming of Christ into the world, the revelation of who he is and that he is the light of the world for ALL people, and we begin our move towards the more sombre, reflective time of Lent. As it says in the introduction to Candlemas in *The Promise of His Glory*:

It is as if we say, 'One last look back at Christmas, and now, turn towards the cross!'

That kind of faith, he explains, is the faith that matters, the faith that justifies, the faith that saves. We need that kind of faith today. These nine studies on James's passionate letter help us to live out a faith that makes a difference.'

healthcare services at breaking point, with vital medicines unavailable and few people able to afford to travel in search of treatment. Our partners at **Habitat for Humanity Lebanon** help vulnerable people improve their living conditions. Part of their work assists Palestinian refugees living in crowded and dilapidated accommodation. Habitat finds the most vulnerable families and helps them make their homes healthier and safer through improvements such as providing clean water and new roofs. Please pray for families in need of healthier and more dignified living conditions.

Volunteers from around the world will travel to the West Bank this month to help Palestinian farmers plant olives. Farmers face the constant threat of losing their land and violence from Israeli settlers, which makes the presence of international volunteers vital. Please pray for a safe planting season and for the solidarity of the volunteers to bring a new hope to those living under occupation.

The theme for the 2019 Synod was the Five Marks and Liturgy. This was supported throughout the week with the most wonderful and worshipful Eucharists, Evening Prayers, workshops, discussion groups, three thought provoking addresses given by the Most Reverend Dr Barry Morgan, formerly Archbishop of Wales, reports from various committees and other synodical business. Bishop Michael announced that when Archdeacon John Holdsworth retires in September 2019 the new Archdeacon of Cyprus is to be Christopher Futcher who has been Archdeacon of Exeter since 2012. He will be joined by his wife Ann who is also priested and will head up Social Matters.

- * Encounter the roots and traditions of the Christian faith


* Begin to understand some of the contemporary issues in Israel and Palestine

- * The Sea of Galilee, including Jesus' "own town" Capernaum.
- * Caesarea Philippi, where Jesus asks: "Who do you say that I am?"
- * The source of the Jordan River.
- *The site of the Transfiguration.
- * The Mount of Olives where Jesus entered Jerusalem in triumph.
- * The Garden of Gethsemane.
- * The remains of the Jerusalem Temple complex from Jesus' day
- * The Way of the Cross, the site of the crucifixion and Jesus' tomb.
- * Emmaus, where Christ appeared after his resurrection.
- * You will also have a chance to worship with the local Anglican community at St George's Anglican Cathedral, and meet our Archbishop, if possible
