

At the Council meeting held on

Monday 9th September 2019 the main item on the agenda for that meeting was labelled "The Future of St Andrew's" and was, and is, directly related to our search for a new Chaplain.

One of the main topics under discussion was how much we could afford to pay for a new Chaplain, whenever we might be able to appoint one. Our previous Chaplain resigned suddenly in May 2018. Once she tendered that resignation the Church Council began the search for a new Chaplain by drawing up a parish profile and a profile of the person they were looking for to lead us into the future. But because of the ongoing unavailability of the Hermitage we have no accommodation to offer a new Incumbent. So, we cannot proceed to make a new appointment.

Now that might seem to some people to be the wrong way of approaching this task. Surely if we have faith and trust in God then God will not only find the right person for us, God will also provide the means for us to be able to pay for that person. And if we are truly doing what God wants of us here in St Andrew's, Kyrenia, then God will also provide the wherewithal for us to carry out our mission to God's glory and to the advancement of God's kingdom here in this place in our time. And they would be absolutely right

And it is to this end that we have started a monthly prayer gathering on the first Thursday of each month, following the mid-week Holy Communion service, to pray only for St Andrew's, for our search for a new leader, for our mission here in Kyrenia, and for God's grace to prosper us and provide for our needs. And we know that prayer will be answered.

But like all prayer, the answer will come through the grace and guidance of the Holy Spirit moving in peoples' hearts to respond to God's will for us and for our community.

For as we read in Luke's Gospel, chapter 14 and verses 28 to 32:

.... which of you, intending to build a tower, does not first sit down and estimate the cost, to see whether he has enough to complete it?

Otherwise, when he has laid a foundation and is not able to finish, all who see it will begin to ridicule him, saying, "This fellow began to build and was not able to finish." Or what king, going out to wage war against another king, will not sit down first and consider whether he is able with ten thousand to oppose the one who comes against him with twenty thousand? If he cannot, then, while the other is still far away, he sends a delegation and asks for the terms of peace.

Jesus here is telling us that we must carefully plan for the future, otherwise like the man building the tower or the king we will be doomed to failure.

Or in the specific case that I'm talking about - employing a new Chaplain - we cannot in all conscience employ someone without knowing that we will be able to continue to pay them for the duration of their employment with us.

And it is because of this that the Council, in discussion with the diocese, have concluded that we are not able to pay a full stipend for a Chaplain, rather that the most we can currently afford is to pay someone approximately half wages plus expenses and, if required, pension payments.

Now this isn't as drastic as it may seem, because that is the way St Andrew's has largely operated in the past. Chaplains have tended to be more mature persons, chronologically gifted, as it were, who were, for example, in receipt of a pension from either their years of service in the church, or from previous employment if they received their call to ministry later in life. So, many Chaplains were ex-Forces who had

completed their military service, perhaps even here in Cyprus, and then decided that there was still a bit of life left in the old dog and why not use it here in Kyrenia.

But, I hope, like, the majority of clergy who have a true vocation, they would not have said, "Oh don't call me on such-and-such a day because I only work part-time. Call the Churchwardens instead." I do hope that wouldn't or didn't happen.

But we cannot, and should not, rely simply on the good will, or even conscience, of an ordained minister and expect them to be available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, at our beck and call, under such employment conditions. For that in any other occupation would be called abuse.

The other thing which came out of our discussion on finance at Council is the need for us to be able to plan and budget for all the various calls on our resources: primarily to employ our Chaplain but also to manage the day-to-day running expenses of St Andrew's.

For one of the unique problems we have as a Chaplaincy, which doesn't occur in most parishes in the worldwide church, is that our worshipping congregation consists essentially of three elements:

Permanent residents of North Cyprus - those of us who live here all year round. We reckon that's about 30 - 35 people on our electoral roll - the church's membership list, if you like

Swallows (a term which some people dislike but forgive me for using it) - people who have residences "back home", wherever that may be, and also here in North Cyprus, spending part of the time in each one throughout the year.

Visitors who come here on holiday and who we are delighted to welcome to worship with us.

All of us who attend or support St Andrew's will probably see yourself as fitting into one of these categories. And it is only from you that we,

here in St Andrew's, can look for the financial support we need - let's be brutally honest - to simply keep going. St Andrew's is a totally self-supporting organisation: we receive no financial assistance from the wider Church, be it diocese or Anglican Communion. All our financial needs have to be met from within ourselves, and the bulk of our finances have to come from direct giving:

- from the money which people put on the plate each Sunday which, of course, in our situation varies in value as exchange rates fluctuate so wildly the Turkish lira which you give this week is now worth roughly half of what it was at the beginning of last year when converted in pounds sterling, which is what a lot of our major expenses, including Chaplain's wages, are paid in. Also, many of our congregation are on fixed incomes, or, in the case of many of our wonderful students who support us in so many other ways, on little or no income at all, bless them.
- from generous donations or bequests made to the church: some of
 which are for specific purposes which, to be frank, does not help with
 our budgeting since that money has to be "ring-fenced" for that purpose.
 Donations and bequests are best received to help run the church
 wherever the money is needed.
- from regular giving by standing order in pounds sterling to the church's bank in the UK.
- Another vital source of income for the parish, which does not cost the giver anything, is if those who can and who meet the criteria laid down
 primarily being a UK taxpayer use Gift Aid.

So, on behalf of St Andrew's we appeal to those who are able to give whatever you can by Standing Order, utilising Gift Aid (again, if you are able).

And to our swallows and visitors, those of you who may be supporting your own home church sacrificially, when you're away, if you can, please

continue to make a donation, occasionally or regularly by standing order, and Gift Aid, to your other spiritual home here in St Andrew's.

The giving leaflet which is available in church and the website at https://www.standrewskyrenia.org/giving/ show how to help St. Andrew's financially in these varied ways.

And as we read in 2 Corinthians 9 and verse 7:

Each of you must give as you have made up your mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.

Amen





We are honoured that the Right Revd Henry Scriven, who will be on holiday in North Cyprus, kindly offered his services via Bishop Michael to any Parish in the Diocese on Sundays in October. Taking advantage of this, and the generous offer of cover for a further Sunday by the Revd Justin Arnott, to whom we offer our sincere congratulations following his priesting in the Cathedral on 21st September, together with the Revd Peter Day. Bishop Scriven will celebrate and preach on Sunday 13th and 20th October, and Justin on 27th October.

Bishop Scriven served for many years with the South American Missionary Society. He was consecrated as Suffragan Bishop in Europe by Archbishop George Carey in 1995. He was also commissioned by Edmond Browning as an assistant bishop to the Convocation of American Churches in Europe. From 2002 to 2008, Bishop Scriven served the Diocese of Pittsburgh as assistant bishop.

He was elected as interim General Secretary of the Evangelical Fellowship of the Anglican Communion (EFAC) by the organization's executive committee on 16 July this year.

The bishop is great-great-grandnephew of Joseph Scriven, Irish poet, best known as the writer of the poem which became the hymn "What a Friend We Have in Jesus".

Jerusalem and the Middle East Church Association - Pray for those who promote and support our Province.


