
From 25/05/22 the requirement to wear masks in closed areas has been removed.

It is recommended that people with upper respiratory tract complaints should use masks in closed areas and public transportation.

It is also recommended that people in the risk group (people over 60 years of age, those with underlying lung, kidney, neurology disease, people who use drugs that suppress the immune system for a long time, diabetes patients, HIV patients) and unvaccinated people, use masks in closed areas.
