# Consecration of the Church of the Epiphany Doha 29<sup>th</sup> September Related by John Worton-Griffiths

Fr Bill Schwartz the Archdeacon in the Gulf and a long standing friend of St Andrews has worked tirelessly to see the Doha Anglican Centre through to completion. When we heard that a date had finally been fixed for the consecration of the Church of the Epiphany at the heart of the Centre, Jenny and I made plans to travel to Doha from Cyprus for the weekend. We represented the Friends of the Diocese and were able to carry greetings from St Andrews.

We arrived in the early hours of Friday morning and after a short sleep joined the Friday worship at the Anglican centre, just one of the complexes alongside Catholic, Orthodox, Indian .... in the "religious area". Cars were parked on every available piece of land and thank goodness we went by taxi. The Anglican centre was bursting at the seams with so many different services taking place, it seemed as though the Christian world had all decided to visit Doha on the same day.

Our Clergy and Friends arrived over the next two days with informal gatherings and a stone laying by our Bishops and Archdeacons past and present. Not a skill taught at theological college, so the craftsmanship was fun to watch. The weekend culminated in the joyful service of thanksgiving and consecration on Sunday evening.

Fr Bill wrote in introduction to the service.

"The **Anglican Centre in Doha**, Qatar, has been built with the kind permission of His Highness The Father Emir, Sheikh Hamad bin Khalifa Al Thani, on a site leased by the State of Qatar. The Centre is also the spiritual home for the Anglican congregation and many other Christian congregations and groups who worship there. This Ecumenical tradition of hospitality is well established in the Anglican Church in the Gulf, where many Christian groups do not have their own dedicated buildings. We



currently accommodate over 60 other Evangelical, Pentecostal and Protestant congregations at the Anglican Centre!

The **Church of the Epiphany** sanctuary was a dream for many Anglicans for many years. Early discussions, plans and fund-raising began in 1999. The scope of the project has changed and grown over the years as the expatriate population in Qatar has grown and changed and now the sanctuary is one of many places for worship in the Anglican Centre.

It is our hope that entering the sanctuary will call to mind our citizenship in heaven; that the administration of sacraments and preaching of the Gospel will draw persons of all nations to a deeper fullness in our mutual calling to represent Christ as his Body in this place; most of all, that God's glory may be experienced by all who worship here."

As Bishop Michael consecrates the sanctuary, the altar, the lectern and the baptismal font today, hallowing these symbols of God's grace for his people, let us all rejoice in his goodness to us. And they sang responsively, praising and giving thanks to the LORD, "For he is good, for his steadfast love endures forever toward Israel."

And all the people responded with a great shout when they praised the LORD, because the foundation of the house of the LORD was laid. Ezra 3:11


The Reredos over the altar was designed and painted by Mark Cazelet.

The tessalated combination of colours reflects the many nationalities and traditions which make up the congregations worshipping in the Church of the Epiphany. The Cross-shaped star reminds us of the cross of Christ, who is the light of the world. 'In him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.' John 1:4-5

The image of a star reminds us of the Epiphany star which appeared at the time of Christ's birth, and the response of the Magi who traveled a great distance to experience the fullness of the revalation of the saviour of the world. *'For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage.' Matthew 2:2b*

#### Wardens World No.5

#### NOT QUITE WHAT WE EXPECTED

'That's life' has been uttered by numberless people across the years as things didn't work out as they expected them to. A warden's life is proving to be a great *pot pourri*. Our new chaplain is delayed and the reaction across the fellowship has been very mixed to say the least. Quite candidly, we have a system for selection that we understand went through Synod, which tells us that we must be very strongly represented at that gathering in the future if we are to have our input, and influence future changes. As I see it, our short-listing was as good as it could have been apart from an American candidate whom we chose not to invite at the time because of cost implications. He has subsequently proved not to be the material we might have hoped he would have been anyway. Surprisingly we interviewed two ladies and a gentleman and all expected the gentleman to come through head and shoulders above everyone else. In interview the reality was that only one of the three was employable, the Rev. Wendy Hough, who was democratically elected by the procedure established at Synod. Personal issues were explored with her as well as her 'fit' within our community. Family matters, the context of the TRNC, and her single status were all questioned. The family factor has raised its head, hence the deferral of Wendy's licensing till 12<sup>th</sup> April 2014, just before Easter. Feeling enormous pressure over all this, Wendy Davies and I had earlier agreed the situation needed opening up to full Council. We reported to Bishop Michael and he subsequently convened a meeting on Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> October with Council and Wendy Hough, to test the situation. Out of this came the pathway forward that we all know about.

The problem with any church fellowship is that Faith, our experience of knowing Christ in our lives and our walk with Him, leaves us, with the strongest views, even divergent views about our local church's operation. Add in our life experience of other formalised organisations and the headaches can become enormous. To all of you who love St Andrew's we pray that love can abound and that we can unite, pulling together with common purpose to proclaim God's love in this place through Christ reflected in our lives. Prejudices can damage and divide and as John Davies comes to us on November 5<sup>th</sup> to support our continuing interregnum till after Christmas, we pray that he will help us unite under the banner of Faith preparing for the climax of our Centenary celebrations, Christmas, the New Year and Wendy's arrival.

WHERE IS GOD IN NATURAL DISASTERS—Page 24 - 2nd paragraph

"Christ is the eternal Word of God, through whom all things were made. He sustains the universe in being. He "became flesh and lived among us" i.e. He became part of his own creation, thereby affirming matter and affirming human life. There is much beauty in the world and it has been superbly said that "The beauty of the world is Christ's tender smile for us coming through matter." This is an important truth to reflect upon. And yet, in the light of recent natural disasters we are driven to ask, "But what of the ugliness of the world? What about hurricane and volcano, earthquake and tsunami and the appalling devastation and suffering they inflict? There is no simple or fully satisfying answer. Yet we have to say, I think - that although Christ the Word is the agent of creation and - in some sense - present within it, he does not intend everything that happens within it! By no means everything that happens is the will of God."



#### Moina Michael: "The Poppy Lady"

Moina Belle Michael was born near Good Hope, Walton County, Georgia, USA on August 15, 1869. At the age of 15 Moina began her career as a teacher, spending time in every section of the educational system in Georgia, teaching in county, town, state and church schools.

The idea for the Flanders Fields Memorial Poppy came to Moina Michael while she was working at the YMCA Overseas War Secretaries headquarters on a Saturday



morning in November 1918, two days before the Armistice was declared at 11 o'clock on 11 November

At about 10.30am, when everyone was on duty elsewhere, Moina found a few moments to read the magazine. In it she came across a page that carried a vivid color illustration for the poem "We Shall Not Sleep" (later named "In Flanders Fields") written by the Canadian Army doctor John McCrae.

Reading the poem on this occasion - she had read it many times before - Moina was transfixed by the last verse -

"To you from failing hands we throw the Torch; be yours to hold it high. If ye break faith with us who die, we shall not sleep, though poppies grow in Flanders Fields."

At that moment Moina Michael made a personal pledge to 'keep the faith' and vowed always to wear a red poppy of Flanders Fields as a sign of remembrance and as an emblem for "keeping the faith with all who died."

Compelled to make a note of this pledge she hastily scribbled down a response on the back of a used envelope, entitled "We Shall Keep the Faith"

Moina Michael died on 10 May 1944


#### WE SHALL KEEP THE FAITH



We cherish, too, the poppy red That grows on fields where valor led; It seems to signal to the skies That blood of heroes never dies, But lends a luster to the red Of the flower that blooms above the dead In Flanders Fields.

And now the Torch and Poppy Red We wear in honor of our dead. Fear not that ye have died for naught; We'll teach the lesson that ye wrought In Flanders Fields.




